Workshop

Visibility in research and communication

05.07.2024, 09:00 - 15:00 h

Sharing research can be challenging, especially for doctoral candidates and postdocs. To make one's research more visible, it is important to sharpen personal profiles to reach new target groups.

The workshop aims to explore these strategies to empower researchers in a practice-oriented manner: a clear message is just as much a part of this as consciously creating research visibility and communicating on social media.

The workshop offers

- an overview of social media as a means for internal and external science communication, its structure, functions and weaknesses (X, TikTok, LinkedIn, Bluesky)
- Techniques, tools and basic strategies for creating a personal profile through communication
- Practical examples and exercises to develop core messages using a rhetorical approach

The workshop aims to

- Explore and teach basic aspects and principles of rhetorical science communication, especially with regard to ethos (image / authenticity)
- support participants in creating more awareness for their research and emphasizing its relevance through self-presentation
- take a practical approach and offer researchers opportunities to build or strengthen their online presence

At the end of the workshop, participants will be able to

- present their research profile in a clear and comprehensible way
- use social media as researchers to connect with different audiences, promote their visibility as researchers and highlight the relevance of their work

Pathways to a successful career in research: Becoming a professor or what else?

Plan your next steps, make strategic career decisions, and consider your personal strengths 10.07.2024, 09:00 - 13:00 h

If your passion is research, many questions arise during your doctorate or postdoc: What do I do to stay successful in the academic system? What next step is important for my academic CV? How do I get a professorship? What do I have to do for this and can I even manage it? What would suit me?

Sometimes the first steps into academia are rather accidental, you enjoy the discipline, there was a suitable position and the path to a doctorate was set. But then what? Even if a career in science cannot be planned down to the last detail: If you are considering staying in academia, you should start making strategic decisions in good time. The workshop will help you to develop an understanding of scientific career paths and to reflect on yourself. What do you bring, what are your strengths, what is holding you back and where should you develop further to fully realise your potential?

Please note: The workshop is also explicitly aimed at women who want to clarify whether a career in science would be conceivable for them.

The workshop offers you input and the opportunity to exchange experiences in the group. With some time apart and the opportunity for individual reflection, there is a one-to-one coaching session for each participant in which a personal concern can be discussed confidentially with the coach.
